





### Race/Ethnicity of Total Population







# **Chronic Absence**





#### **Look Who is Doing Great Work in Mamaroneck!**

The Mamaroneck Child Development Center is a Head Start and Day Care Center serving 51 children (3 and 4 years old) from low income families living primarily in Mamaroneck. Their mission is to provide a warm, loving and safe environment that promotes the development of the whole child: physical, social-emotional, cognitive, and language/literacy. The MCDC believe that parents are the child's first and primary teacher, and that parents are their partners in the education of the child. With this belief, MCDC provides monthly parent education and support groups and assist parents in accessing additional community resources, such as health insurance, food stamps, and referrals to CPSE for speech and learning delays.
