Est. in 1914

A group of citizens starts Westchester Children's Association, underwriting the salaries of Westchester's first 6 child welfare workers.

- Led the movement to establish a Children's Court in Westchester, the first in New York State.
- Placed the first clinical psychologist in the county's public schools.
- Initiated Operations Crossroads, connecting children and families involved in the Family Court with needed services and programs.

1990s

- Founded the Campaign for Kids, which now comprises of more than 80 organizations.
- Established the Yonkers Family Court Children's Center to care for young children whose parents had to appear as litigants (now operated by YWCA of Yonkers).
- Formed the Child Health Task Force with the Westchester County Department of Health to prepare for the expansion of statesponsored health insurance for children.

2000s

- Secured \$7+ million of Westchester County funding for children and youth services and made children a top priority for government spending.
- Convenes an inter-agency Home Visiting Workgroup to expand early childhood home visiting programs to help new parents improve their parenting skills and connect to community resources.
- Convenes the Connecting Youth Workgroup with representatives from public and private organizations to improve outcomes for youth ages 16 to 24 who are not working or in school.

2010s

- Secured the first-ever grant for Westchester's foster youth who age out of care to help them start their independent adult lives.
- Coordinated government and community agencies to enroll more than 10,000 eligible children in free or low-cost health insurance.
- Published "Making the Invisible Visible: Child and Youth Homelessness" report in 2019 and the Westchester County Child and Youth Homelessness Data Dashboard in 2020 to monitor the experiences of homeless children and advocate for affordable housing and a more universal definition of homelessness.
- Launched Remote Learning Parents Survey in 2020 and the Digital Access Survey in 2022 to monitor rates of internet access and help families gain digital literacy



Nicole's inspiration for **Her Honor Mentoring** came from a desire to work proactively in her own community. Nicole started Her Honor Mentoring while simultaneously working as a senior staff attorney at the Legal Aid Society's Criminal Defense Division in Bronx County.

In addition to her J.D. from New York Law School, Nicole also holds a B.A. from The State University of New York at Buffalo. She is also a partner at Mentzer and Sheindlin, LLP, a law firm that handles all aspects of criminal and civil litigation.

Her Honor Mentoring, Judge Judy and Nicole Sheindlin have received numerous accolades such as the New York State Senate Woman of Distinction, Champion of Human Rights Award from the Westchester County Human Rights Commission, and Community Champion Award in Education and Literacy from Volunteer New York of the United Way.
