in 2019, WCA provided advocacy training to incarcerated youth to empower them to make better choices. We published a report *Making the Invisible Visible - Westchester's Hidden Homeless Children & Youth* and created a child and youth homelessness workgroup focused on getting better data on our children and families living in doubled-up and overcrowded housing. We also published our *2019 Children by the Numbers Data Bulletin* with voices from the community and takeaways for Advocacy & Action.

This spring, families began to deal with the COVID-19 pandemic disrupting life as we knew it. **WCA quickly pivoted our work to address the impact of the novel Coronavirus on our most vulnerable populations.** WCA surveyed families and school superintendents to document the impact COVID had on the learning environment. Over 900 people responded to our survey highlighting the problems of access to technology and the social and emotional toll of remote learning.

If the pandemic has shown us anything, it has unearthed the importance of civic engagement at all levels of government. **WCA was timely in launching Project 2020 this past fall to support young people in fighting for the change they want to see in their communities and in voting.**

In the shadow of the pandemic, the nation vehemently expressed its outrage over the disproportionate impact of police violence on black lives. WCA has long recognized that race and ethnicity play a fundamental role in providing and taking away opportunities. **Lack of access for many children is why we continue to advocate for early childhood supports to offer an equitable start life. We were contracted as the backbone agency for the state's Hudson Valley - Home Visiting Development Plan.** WCA continues its fight to give all young people a fair chance for a productive future.

These are extraordinary times, but WCA has not stopped. Now more than ever we need fierce advocates for kids. Your generous and continuous donations allow us to continue to advocate, mobilize and demand change. We are thankful and energized by your investment and the work of our community partners, hardworking staff and dedicated board.

In partnership we can reimagine and make a better life for all Westchester's children.

Why this matters

Evidence shows the earlier services are received, the more effective they are. Delays in service delivery may mean delays in achieving positive outcomes.

Our Work

- Released **Vision 0 to 3: Next Steps report** - our action plan for early childhood advocacy and follow-up to WCA's Vision 0 to 3 Conference.
- **Selected by NYS to participate in its First 1,000 Days on Medicaid Workgroup**, which collaborated to ensure young children on Medicaid have better health and life outcomes.
- Served as the **backbone organization for the Hudson Valley region of the New York State Home Visiting Coordination Initiative**, coordinating 2 regional summits to identify challenges and opportunities for home visiting programs for young children.



Youth Justice

Our Work

- **Westchester youth arrests and detention placements decreased substantially** since the Raise the Age Law went into effect in October 2018, with 85% of youth diverted to community alternatives.
- Raise the Age: 6 Months-In Panel Discussion on implementation of Raise the Age legislation was **attended by over 100 community members, service providers, government personnel, and county leaders.**
- **WCA held a Raise the Age Education Roundtable Discussion with school districts, county administrators, and Woodfield Cottage Detention Center** to explore solutions to improve education for justice involved youth.
- Advocacy Training workshops with 25 youth at Woodfield Cottage Detention Center over three weeks, **provided positive, interactive opportunities for youth to develop their voice to speak up for change and advocate for themselves in all situations.**

More young people are directed to rehabilitative, age-appropriate services than jail.

Child & Youth Homelessness



Why this matters

Race continues to be a primary factor in determining children's outcomes. WCA views data through a race equity lens to highlight and then address existing inequities.

Our Work

- Released our groundbreaking report, *Making the Invisible Visible: Westchester's Hidden Homeless Children and Youth*, a comprehensive investigation into homelessness among children and youth across Westchester County that featured data analysis, community conversations and recommendations.
- Launched our **Child & Youth Homelessness Workgroup** to connect stakeholders, service providers, and leaders addressing homelessness from a children and youth-focused lens.
- Our **annual Advocacy Breakfast, "Building Solutions at the Intersection of Poverty, Racism, and Homelessness"** featured keynote speaker, Marc Dones, Executive Director of National Innovation Service.
- Released **Ground Truthing podcast episode** discussing solutions for homelessness and trends in Westchester.

Why this matters

People who vote are people who advocate. We are working to build a generation of future advocates to speak for themselves and for their own children.

Our Work

- Designed and facilitated our **Project 2020 initiative civic engagement toolkits and workshops with youth** from the Peekskill Youth Bureau and Boys and Girls Club of New Rochelle to mobilize and empower youth.
- **Vote4kids surveyed and publicized candidates** for the Westchester Board of Legislators' priorities for children from all 17 legislative districts.
- **WCA secured a historic funding increase of \$450,000 for Invest in Kids** youth development programs by mobilizing youth, families, and community organizations to speak up for children in the Westchester County Budget.


