Dear Friends,

As we reflect on the past year, we are filled with immense pride and gratitude for the milestones achieved and the impact made by the Westchester Children's Association (WCA) in 2023. Our commitment to advocating for the children and youth of Westchester County remains unwavering, and our collective efforts have continued to bring about positive change in our community.

2023 was a pivotal year for our advocacy initiatives. Our educational efforts on social and emotional challenges young people face in Westchester resulted in increased funding for mental health services. Our collaboration with local policymakers led to the implementation of new policies aimed at reducing juvenile incarceration rates and promoting restorative justice practices. These policies are already showing promising results, with a noticeable decrease in youth detentions and an increase in community-based interventions.

Our annual Advocacy Breakfast featured Edward Fergus of Rutgers University who focused attention on the intersection of policy and advocacy in classrooms.

He challenged us to confront our biases and prejudices so we can understand how young people are affected, especially those who are often overlooked and marginalized.

Data-driven decision-making has always been a cornerstone of our approach. In 2023, we published our signature Children by the Numbers publication highlighting the state of child well-being in Westchester County. This report has been instrumental in guiding our advocacy efforts and has provided valuable insights for our partners and policymakers. Our commitment to transparency and accountability ensures that our work remains focused on the most pressing needs of our community.

None of this would be possible without the unwavering support of our donors, volunteers, and community partners. Your generosity and dedication fuel our mission and inspire us to strive for excellence every day. We extend our heartfelt thanks to each of you for your continued support and belief in the work we do.

Together, we are making a difference in the lives of Westchester's children. Thank you for being a part of this journey with us.

Child Poverty

Raising awareness and advocating for policies to **alleviate child poverty** are essential for ensuring every child has access to necessities and opportunities.

WCA as member of **Child Poverty Reduction Advisory Council** advanced policies on housing, tax policy, employment/wages, and public benefits to support low-income households.

Child & Youth Homelessness

Unstable housing and homelessness put Westchester's children at risk of developmental delays and health issues, making it crucial to connect families to resources **that ensure housing safety and stability.**

WCA launched a court-watching program to understand eviction proceedings and guide our advocacy efforts to prevent homelessness. Successfully advocated for county passage of **"Right to Counsel."**

Early Childhood Support

Investing in **early childhood support** is essential for lifelong health and success, laying the foundation for growth and school readiness.

WCA was sought after to convene first-ever Head Start workgroup to identify challenges in local programs, including space logistics, declining enrollment barriers and staffing issues.

Advocating for youth justice and investing in preventative measures supports fair treatment, reduces recidivism, and fosters safer communities.

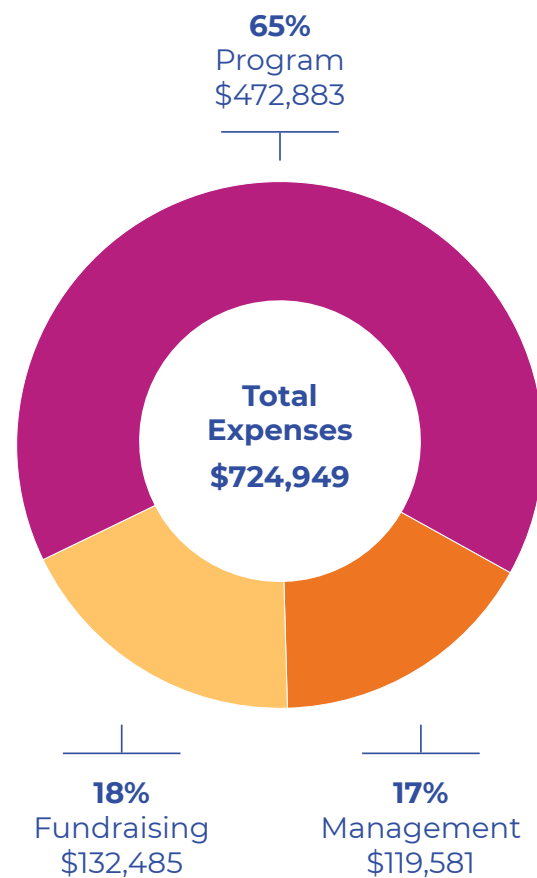
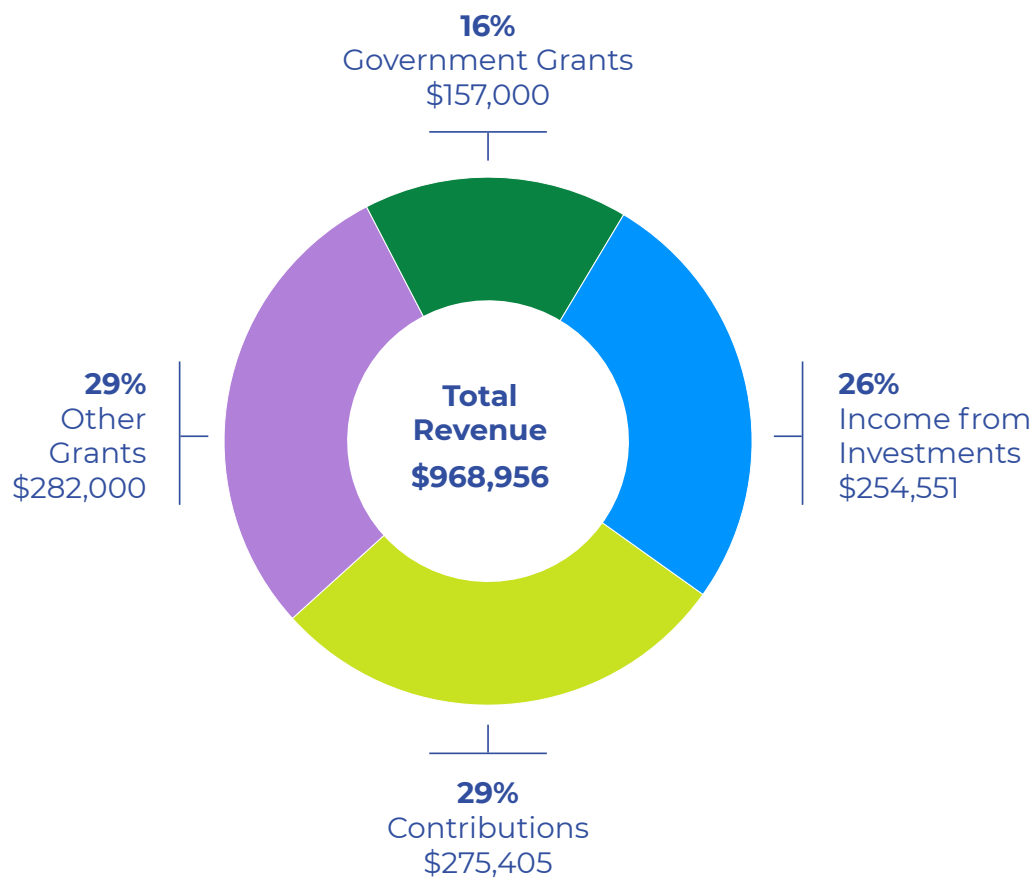
