With few exceptions, organizations featured in Poverty Pulse are reporting increased demand for essential services from January to March 2025 compared to the same time period in 2024. This suggests the rise is not merely seasonal, but part of a longer-term trend.



- \* Fully Implement Universal School Meals
- \* Expand and Fully Fund the Statewide Housing Voucher Program
- Increase the NY State Child Tax Credit
- \* Pass the Working Families Tax Credit
- Speak Out Against Federal Cuts in Medicaid and SNAP.




**UNITED WAY OF WESTCHESTER & PUTNAM's**






## **Number of 211 Calls Requesting Essential Need Assistance**
